Course Title: Gen 5005 - Pedagogy and Psychology

1. Course Description

The academic discipline "Pedagogy and Psychology of Higher Education" is designed to form in graduates of higher education an understanding of the nature of the human psyche, to arm them with knowledge of the main mental functions and their physiological mechanisms, the relationship between natural and social factors in the formation of the personal sphere of a person, to familiarize them with the main conceptual provisions of pedagogy, as well as moral, psychological and ethical problems of professional activity. Studying the course involves the formation in master's students of an understanding of the essence of consciousness, its relationship with the unconscious, the role of consciousness and self-awareness in the behavior, communication and activities of people, the formation and consistent development of personality.
